### To Test Strength of Material.

It is very desirable to be able to test the strength of a piece of material before purchasing it. To do this, examine the ravled threads of the cloth and notice how the warp threads compare in strength with the woof or filling threads. A fine warp will not stand the strain from a heavy filling thread. Therefore materials woven in this way are not strong, neither are those which have a heavy cord woven in beside a very fine thread.

A recent study on works councils in the United States by the national industrial conference board, furnishing another evidence of the widespread interest in plans for representation of employees in industry, covers 176 companies or corporations having works councils in 252 different industrial plants, affecting approximately 500,000 workers. In addition to those plans created as a result of awards of the national war labor board, the shipbuilding labor adjustment board and other government agencies, there are 105 which were voluntarily put in operation by employers. The term "works council," which has not been generally adopted in this country, was determined upon, the report states, as being more definite and exact than that of "shop committee," which has been commonly used.
