Local News

Mr. W. L. Horne was dinner host to Graham Kiwanis directors last Thursday night. Eleven members were present. After the dinner a business meeting was held.

A party composed of McBride Holt, Hallie Moore, W. N. Stansell, George Long and John Hoffman are on a fishing trip at Swansboro and Morehead City, this week.

A Sunday School rally was held at the Presbyterian church Sunday morning. The objective being to procure an enrollment of 50 additional attendants at Sunday School.

Last Friday night at the home of Mrs. J. T. Roach the members of the Needle Craft Club gave a wiener roast and had their husbands, children and friends as their guests.

Judge Carroll sentenced two men, E. R. Martin and R. C. Childrey, employees of the mills at Haw River, to terms of six months on the roads for the theft of cloth, in his court Tuesday.

The attractive granite veneer residence of Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Burke, near the junction of W. Elm and West Harden streets, is approaching completion. They are hoping to occupy it right soon.

Tobacco growers of Alamance are signing Agricultural Adjustment Administration contracts in large numbers for 1936-'37 crops. About 70 percent of the growers so far have signed. The number is expected to reach over a thousand.

Last Saturday night in a negro settlement on the Burlington-Glencoe road, in an altercation, Russell Harvey fired a load of shot into the thigh of Randolph Collins. Collins was sent to Duke hospital, his leg had to be amputated and he died Tuesday. Harvey is held in jail.

Mrs. J. M. Buckner received a wire Monday, advising her of the death of her brother, Michael Stuart, at Sheridan, Indiana, during the previous night. Mrs. Buckner, her sister, Mrs. J. C. Griffin of Snow Camp, Ruth Buckner, Anne and Howard Griffin left Monday afternoon for Sheridan.

Called to Haw River Sunday for another purpose, Sheriff Stockard found a man named Patterson who was wanted in Columbus, Georgia, to answer a charge of arson. The presence of the Sheriff was too much for Patterson's conscience, so he put his legs in action. He was pursued, captured and landed in jail. Today he is returning to Georgia to face his accusers.

The State Fair opened at Raleigh Monday, but there is not now the rush to attend the Raleigh Fair that there used to be, when almost everybody who attended a fair at all went there. A "bit and miss" for a year or so is responsible for the lost interest, and it is not because the State Fair is not a bird's-eye-view of the State's products of all kinds. The State should foster a big State Fair to promote a generous rivalry in doing worth while things.

Yes and no! On Monday night, last week, the Board of Aldermen of the City of Burlington passed an ordinance to permit the picture theatres to operate on Sunday, beginning on Oct. 27th, and on Monday night the Board met and rescinded the ordinance. In the meantime the ministers of Burlington met, prepared and published a protest against the desecration of the Sabbath. Other church and civic organizations voiced their disapproval. People who believe that the Sabbath day is ordained for a day of rest and to be kept holy will heartily approve the abrogation of the ordinance. That there are many questionable things, sanctioned by law, done on the Sabbath day is no argument for opening the bars wider. A proper and becoming observance of the Sabbath is not puritanical.
