Mowing Machine
There is probably no piece of farm nt that suffers more from oor adjustment and lack of care he mowing machine. Most cutting traubles of the mower can traced to the cutting bar. This bar traced to the cutting bar. This bar is a vital part of a mower and consists of a series of shears whose blades must be kept sharp for best results. The two parts form best results. The two parts forming the shears are known as knife sections and ledger plates, and they must be properly adjusted along the entire length of the cutter bar. The knife holder must keep the sections down against the ledger plates without binding and without toe much clearance. In repairing a mower it is precessary to response all the is necessary to remove all the broken or badly worn knife sections by shearing them off. This is easily ne over the anvil by cutting out the rivets. If the guards have be come dulled, they may be sharp-ened by grinding them to a blunt point. Guards that are too badly worn or have broken ledger plates should be replaced. Badly worn shearing plates or knife holders can also be replaced, and it is very important that all guards fit snugly against the cutter bar.

NOW IT CAN BE TOLD!

Remember those dark days in early 1942, when the Axis tide of conquest was spreading over the world like a plague? That was when the Transportation Corps of the War Department asked the Southern Railway System to teach the fine art of railading to American soldiers who would some day have the job of operating military railroads in a distant "theatre of operations."

SOUTHERN RAILWAY SYSTEM
