Calf Care

Calves should be kept in individ-ual pens, where practical, until they are three to four months old. After reaching that age they may be housed in groups of two to four. A constant, fresh supply of water should be kept available to the calves. After the calf is four to six months old, it should have access to all the tender graxing it will take. 

THE B-29 BEFORE YOU DID

Months of laborious, back-breaking labor of thousands of Chinese workers were sacrificed by demolition in a heart-breaking few hours in the retreat before the onslaught of the attacking Japanese. Stores of precious gasoline-partsand other scarce hard-to-get stores flown at great risk over the famous "Hump" were put to the torch. A terrific set-back - an almost unendurable discouragement.
