By concentration of power and drafts on the Federal Treasury we now have a bewildering govern mental agglomeration impossible of democratic control. Wasteful and inefficient, by nature it is the instru-mentality of favoritism, oppression and corruption. It is the destroyer of self-reliance, self-respect and selfgoverning ability without which no people can remain free."

A public awakening will save this country from any form of tyranny. Mr. Sumners does not doubt this. He said, "Washington is as sensitive to the changing currents of pub-lic opinion as a barometer is to record changes in the weather." If acts of congress fail to reflect pub-lic sentiment, it is because such sentiment is itself confused or indis-tinct to the majority.

Fire-Fighting

The newer technique of fighting a gasoline fire with fog-nozzles, giving a fine spray of water, has achieved dramatic results. A high-stakes test of this water-fog technique was made last winter in New Haven, when a freight train piled up and a tank car of gasoline caught fire, threatening the main mercantile area of the city. The fire spread quickly, with over 10,000 gallons of burning gasoline flooding the right of-way and endangering buildings beside the railroad. The fire department, equipped with fog-nozzles and other fog appliances, went into action, using a technique which they had been practicing for the previous six months. In 25 minutes, they reduced the area of fire from sevced the area of fire from several hundred feet to 30 feet in di-ameter. In 40 minutes, the fire was

Home economists test with a drop When water dropped on of water. the griddle bounces in a lively manner, the metal is just the right heat The griddle is too the batter. cool if the water sizzles and evapo rates slowly; too hot if the drop seems to explode when it touches This test may be on waffle irons that do not have omatic indicators.

Another test for the waffle iron is made with a piece of paper. When the iron is just hot enough, paper placed between the grids browns in about half a minute. If the paper takes more than a half minute to brown, the iron is too cool; if it scorches immediately,
