Mild Bacon

Bacon that you buy in the store should be kept in the refrigerator. This is because commercially cured bacon has changed in the last 10 to 15 years. Formerly most bacon was of the salty type—the kind produced generally on farms by a longer and stronger cure. This saltier bacon can be kept, as it is on farms, hanging in the air during cool weather. On the other hand, mild-cured bacon, which is the kind now generally selling in stores, is more like fresh meat and always should be kept in the refrigerator—and only for a few weeks after it is purchased.

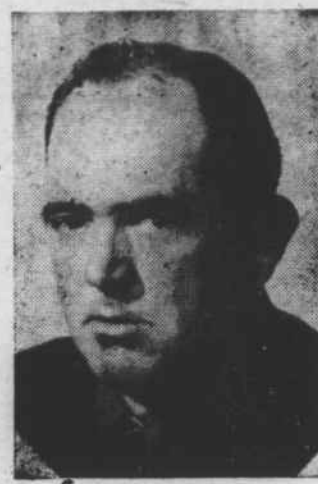
