Experiment

Nationalization of industry is the big issue in England. The Labor government, elected last year on a nationalization platform, is proceeding to carry out the program as rapidly as possible.

First step was the nationalization of the Bank of England, upon which the government long has relied for more or less of its own financing.

The Bank of England also was given power to require other banks of the country to accept such banking policies as it might decide to issue.

Industries slated for nationalization by the Labor government are: (1) Transportation, including railroads, transport buses, street-cars, canal barges, and coastal shipping.

Perhaps the most complex problems for nationalization are presented by the iron and steel industry. This is a highly skilled craft, requiring skills and know-how to be found only in the present management of the industry.

Some government economist told me that the government would take over production of steel and iron up to the point where the metal was allowed to cool, regardless of the form in which that metal might be.

Some observers in England think difficulties will be so great that the government finally will give up the scheme of nationalizing the iron and steel industries.
