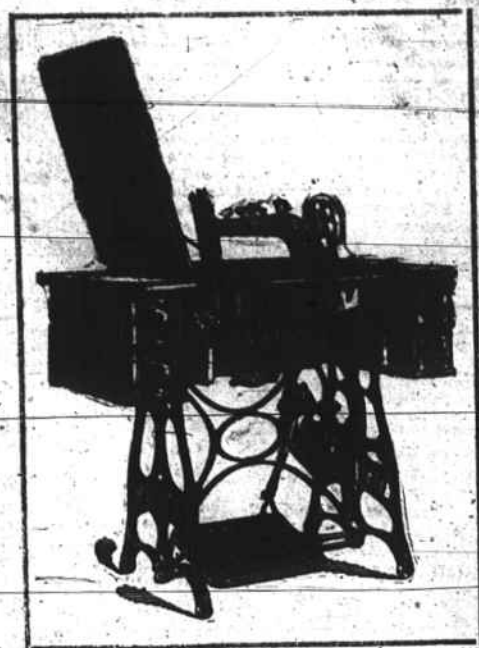

As there seems to be right much talk of the coming campaign in this county there is one thing we wish to especially remind the voters of Franklin county and that is to guard well their actions and vote more especially in the selection of delegates to the convention that the selection of candidates may be so universally satisfactory that this good old county may retain its standing as second in the State for Democratic majorities. There is absolutely no personal reasons in this, but you will remember that the number of delegates both to State, district and county conventions are based upon this majority and the more you can have at either the stronger are the chances for the recognition of the county in their respective nominations.  
By all means gentlemen bear these things in mind and be sure you are right before it is too late to act.

**A LETTER.**  
The editor of the TIMES is in receipt of the following letter from Senator T. P. Gore, dated at Washington, D. C., making the inquiries contained therein and immediately after each inquiry will be found the answer furnished him. The letter is as follows:  
January 1st, 1910  
To THE EDITOR:  
My Dear Sir:— The editor is usually the ears and eyes of his community. He knows as well as and better than anyone else, the needs of the people and the State and tendency of public sentiment. In a government like our own, the Congress should be a mirror. The law should be, as far as practical, a reflex and an image of the popular will. That public official conserves

the people best who best knows their needs and wishes. I should therefore, be deeply indebted to you for an expression of your views and the views of your section upon the following subjects, so far as you may be pleased to comply with this request:  
1st Are the people of your section favorable or unfavorable to:  
2nd The recent tariff law? Unfavorable.  
3rd Further reduction at an early date? Favorable.  
4th Free raw material? They are in favor of free raw material, provided the tariff on the manufactured product of the material is reduced in the same proportion.  
5th Ship Subsidy? Unfavorable.  
6th Conservation of national resources? Favorable.  
Do you and your people view with favor or disfavor:  
1st Central Bank? Disfavor.  
2nd Postal Savings Banks? Disfavor, unless the money deposited in such banks is required to be loaned to the people in the community or State where it is deposited.  
3rd Federal rather than State charters for interstate carriers? Disfavor.  
Has the cost of living advanced during the last year and if so, to what cause is it attributed? Yes. Tariff and trusts protected by tariff and the example in extravagance set the people by Congress.  
Do you pay more or less for print paper than six months ago? We buy under old contract made January 1st, 1909.  
I trust that you will not deem these inquiries presumptuous and feel sure that you will receive them in the patriotic spirit that has inspired them.  
Assuring you that I should greatly appreciate the favor of an answer, I beg to remain with best wishes for a prosperous New Year.
