Hughes Sends Wilson Delayed Congratulations.

Lakewood, N. J., Nov. 22.—Charles E. Hughes, Republican candidate for President in the recent election, tonight sent to President Wilson a telegram congratulating him upon his re-election.

In his telegram Mr. Hughes said: "Because of the closeness of the vote I have awaited the official count in California and now that it has been virtually completed, permit me to extend to you my congratulations upon your re-election. I desire also to express my best wishes for a successful administration."

Willcox Statement.

New York, Nov. 22.—William H. Willcox, chairman of the Republican National Committee tonight issued the following statement in reference to Mr. Hughes' telegram to President Wilson:

"Having conferred by telephone during the day and late this afternoon with the Republican State committee and the Republican national committee in California I am informed that the official canvass of the vote has been so nearly completed that no change will result from the few precincts not counted in the returns thus far compiled.

"This means that the majority for the Wilson electors in California ranges from about 1,200 to 3,800 votes and that this is the final result of the canvass for which we have been waiting. So far as any recount is concerned, the national committee is not advised that there are sufficient grounds to call for such an application."

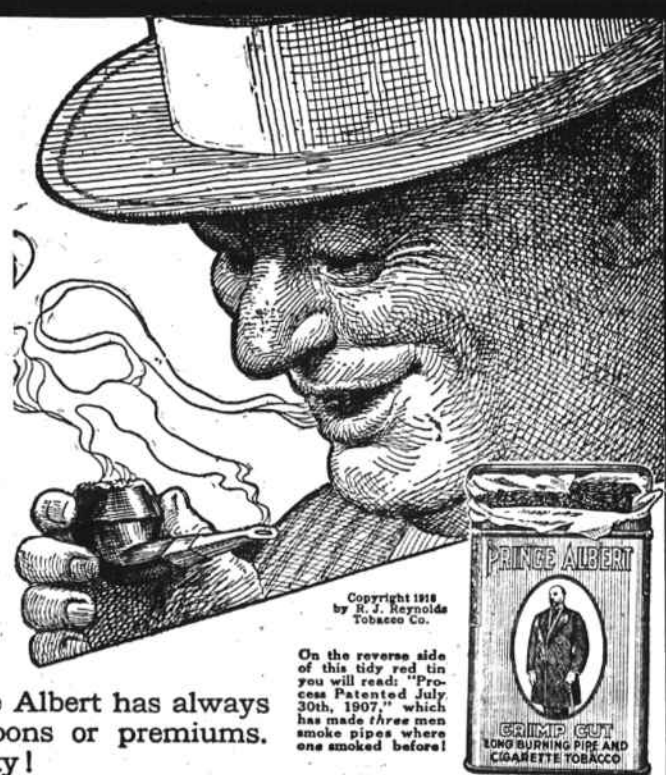
