At a recent hearing of the Federal Trade Commission there was introduced correspondence taken from the private files of Swift & Company, which showed that the Company had been considering for some time an educational advertising campaign.

First the Government takes \$15.00 per month of the \$30 that a new sol-

If she has one child she gets \$40.00 a month. If two children she gets \$47.50. If three children \$52.50. If four children \$57.50. If five children \$62.50. If six children \$65.00 per month.

Bills, Heat and Light free. Uncle Sam does all this for married men so he need have no anxiety about his family while he is away doing his duty.
