Special County School Tax Election.
Upon petition of the County Board of Education of Franklin County, State of North Carolina, said petition being in due form and properly presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, State of North Carolina. It is hereby ordered that an election be held in said County of Franklin, State of North Carolina in accordance with the provisions of Section 4114 Pells Revisal 1908 as amended by an act of the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina at its session of 1911 chapter 71 at which election shall be ascertained the will of the people in said County of Franklin, whether there shall be levied on all taxable property and polls of said County a special tax, not to exceed 30 (thirty) cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of property and 90 (ninety) cents on each poll to, supplement the School Fund of said County.

The said election shall be held on the 14th day of May, 1918 and the polling places shall be the usual polling or voting place in each precinct or Township of the County.
