SHERIFF RESIGNS IN VANCE COUNTY

Several Candidates Seeking Toga Laid Down Last Week By Sheriff Bell.

Henderson, July 1.—Several candidates are out for the office of sheriff of Vance county to succeed Sheriff J. E. C. Bell, who resigned last Saturday after having served for three years. The election takes place next Monday when the board of county commissioners will hold its monthly meeting. Sheriff Bell gave no explanation for resigning, simply requesting the commissioners to accept it immediately, which was done by a unanimous vote. Coroner E. A. Kelley is now acting sheriff of the county and Deputy Sheriff J. C. Champion and Jailer Tobias Kelley were continued in their positions.

NEW COUNCIL OF FIVE IS ORGANIZED IN PARIS

Lansing, Pichon, Balfour, Tittoni and Makino Form It—Will Run Peace Conference.

Paris, July 1.—Premier Clemenceau Secretary of State Lansing, Foreign Minister Balfour, Foreign Minister Pichon, Baron Makino and Viscount Chinda, of Japan, and Foreign Minister Tittoni, of Italy, decided this afternoon to constitute a new council of five. This council of five will have as its members Secretary Lansing, M. Pichon, Foreign Minister Balfour, Foreign Minister Tittoni and Baron Makino, head of the Japanese delegation. The council will temporarily assume direction of peace conference affairs. A council of 10 will not be constituted at present.

WILMINGTON MEETING WOULD RECALL OFFICERS

Wilmington, July 1.—Following the upheaval in city council last night when Councilmen Wade and Curtis, newly elected labor members, were turned out of their respective departments of fire and police, the Wilmington Trades council tonight named a committee to appear before council Monday night and demand the reinstatement of the deposed department heads.

A mass meeting, however, held following this action, in which others than labor men participated, declared for a recall of Mayor Moore, and all the councilmen and petition will be circulated immediately for signers to hold another election. The regular election was held only 60 days ago.

LARGEST EXPORT TRADE IN COUNTRY'S HISTORY

Washington, July 1.—Exports from the United States during May were valued at \$606,379,599, the Department of Commerce announced today, and on the basis of estimates covering June exports, exports for the fiscal year ending yesterday have amounted to \$6,506,000,000, by far the largest total in the history of American foreign trade. The greatest export total previously recorded, during the fiscal year 1917, was \$6,230,000,000. Imports for May as announced were valued at \$328,927,139, and estimates

of June imports bring the probable total of imports for the fiscal year to \$3,102,000,000, leaving an estimated balance in trade for the United States of \$3,704,000,000. This also exceeds the previous record total, that of the fiscal year 1917, when the balance in trade favoring the United States was reported at \$3,631,000,000.
