AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF GRADED SCHOOL TRUSTEES OF LOUISBURG TO ISSUE BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ERRECTING AND EQUIPPING ADDITIONAL SCHOOL BUILDINGS FOR THE LOUISBURG GRADED SCHOOL DISTRICT.

Section 1. That for the purpose of providing increased school facilities, either by the erection of a new building or buildings, or the enlargement of the present building, the board of graded school trustees of Louisburg be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds of the Louisburg Graded School District to be styled "Louisburg Graded School Building Bonds," to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars of such denominations as said board of graded school trustees may deem advisable.
