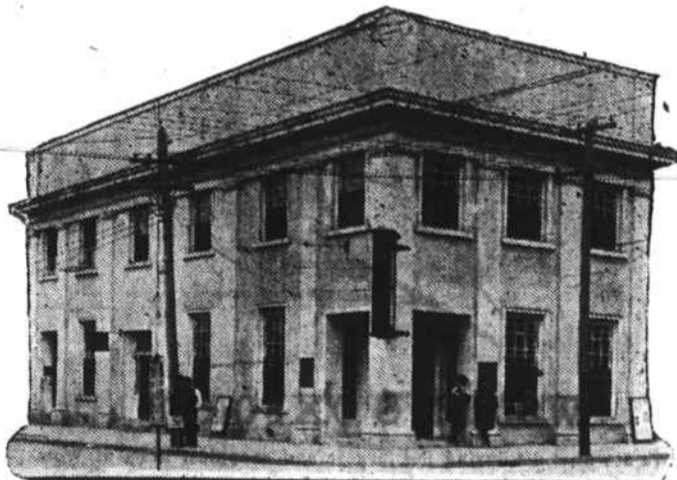

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

Upon petition of more than one-third of the qualified voters in the Cedar Rock Academy District No. 3 of Cedar Rock Township, Franklin County, State of North Carolina, said petition being in due form and duly endorsed by the Board of Education of Franklin County, and it appearing from said petition that the present special tax levied for the support and maintenance of the schools in the said District is inadequate to maintain and support the said schools:

It is hereby ordered that an election be held in said District as provided by Section 5535 Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina, 1919, at which election shall be ascertained the will of the people within said School District, whether or not the said special tax levy shall be increased from 30c to 50c on the \$100.00 valuation of property within said District for the purpose of supplementing the funds for the maintenance and support of schools in said District.

The said election shall be held on Saturday, June 17, 1922. The polling place shall be at the Cedar Rock Academy School building. A new registration shall be made and T. H. Sledge is hereby appointed Registrar and J. W. Dean and W. D. Gordon are hereby appointed poll holders. The boundaries of the said school district as fixed by the County Board of Education of Franklin County are as follows:

Beginning at the county line at Red Bud creek; thence up said creek to the mouth of branch running between Anna Collins and Ollie Collins; thence up said branch to its head; thence westward to and along lines of Buck Collins and Sam Bartholomew to Buck Collins corner; thence south along Buck Collins line to the path leading from John Mays to Saint Delight's; thence along said path to Saint Delight's Church; thence along G. W. Ford and Mrs. Tucker's line westward to Ford's corner; thence along lines of Ford, Dr. Bobbitt, W. O. Stone, J. R. Earle and Henry Harper to the Louisburg and Nashville road; thence along that road westward to J. A. and T. P. Dean's corner; thence along J. A. Dean's and W. W. Boone's lines to John Wester's line; thence along Wester's line to the Raleigh road; thence along Wester's line and Mrs. W. W. Boone's line westward to reach Tree creek; thence down said creek to the Coppedge Mill site; thence along the Spring Hope road northward to the Cedar Rock church for colored people; thence along lines of Battle, Gordon, and W. B. Coppedge eastward to Wm. Inscove's corner; thence along the lines of and including Wm. Inscove, John Inscove, Jos. T. Inscove, George Boone to the Shearin line; thence along Boone and Shearin line to the road leading by Boone's residence; thence along that road to the Louisburg and Nashville road and along that road to the county line at Belford Church; thence along county line to the beginning.

(On Sept. 1st, 1919 the property and real estate of W. P. Cooke was added to these boundaries by petition. On February 7th, 1921 the lands of J. W. Gardner, J. T. Fisher and W. B. Gordon were added to these boundaries.)

The registration books shall be opened on Saturday, May 6th, 1922 and the registrar will have said books at the said polling place on each Saturday during period extending from May 6th to June 3rd, upon which last named day the registration books shall close.
