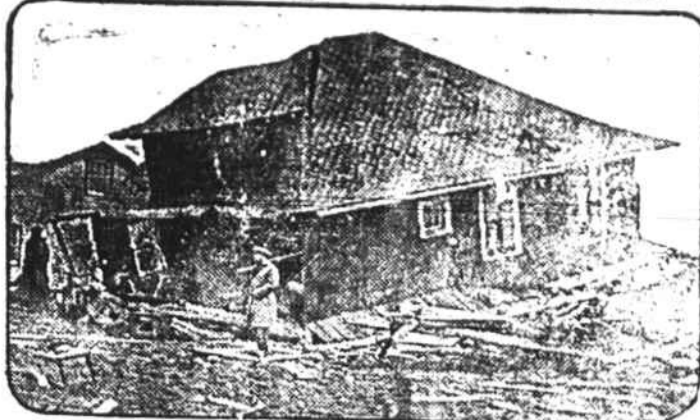


More Exciting Than the Movie

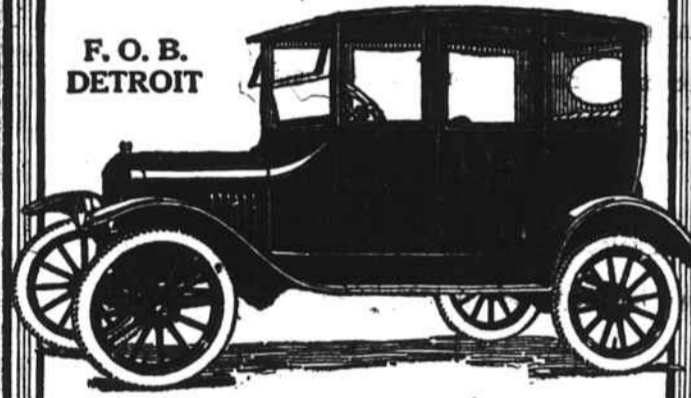
