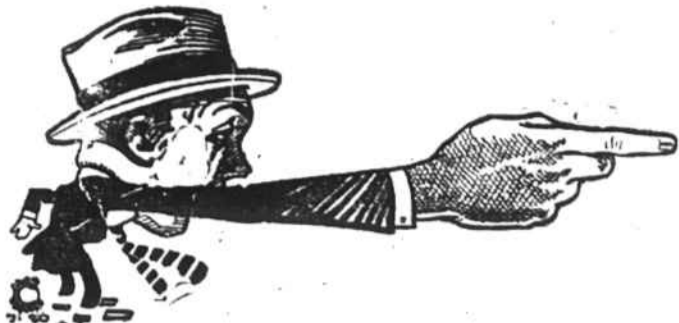
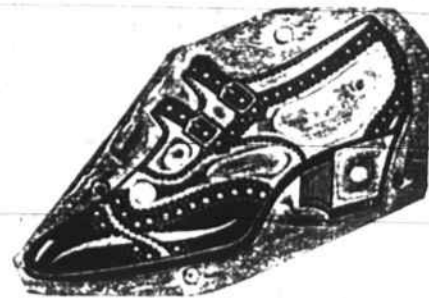

What of Radio in the Future?

Already it reaches ships in any parts of the ocean, the isolated farm can listen to music and lectures in the cities. Medical advice has been sent by radio where it was impossible to reach a patient by other means. Information is broadcasted to the farmer on crop and weather conditions. Fire warnings have been sent out and the way of the crook will be made harder through ability to broadcast a record of his activities to every community in the land.

The future possibilities of radio are inconceivable. Various principles which will make it more applicable to business and social life are just being worked out. The supreme inventive genius of the country, the greatest organizing ability and the most powerful resources are now at the service of the new art, with the result that

radio has made greater strides in the two years than in the ten years previous.

No other nation has such a combination of air communication resources for the benefit of its people.
