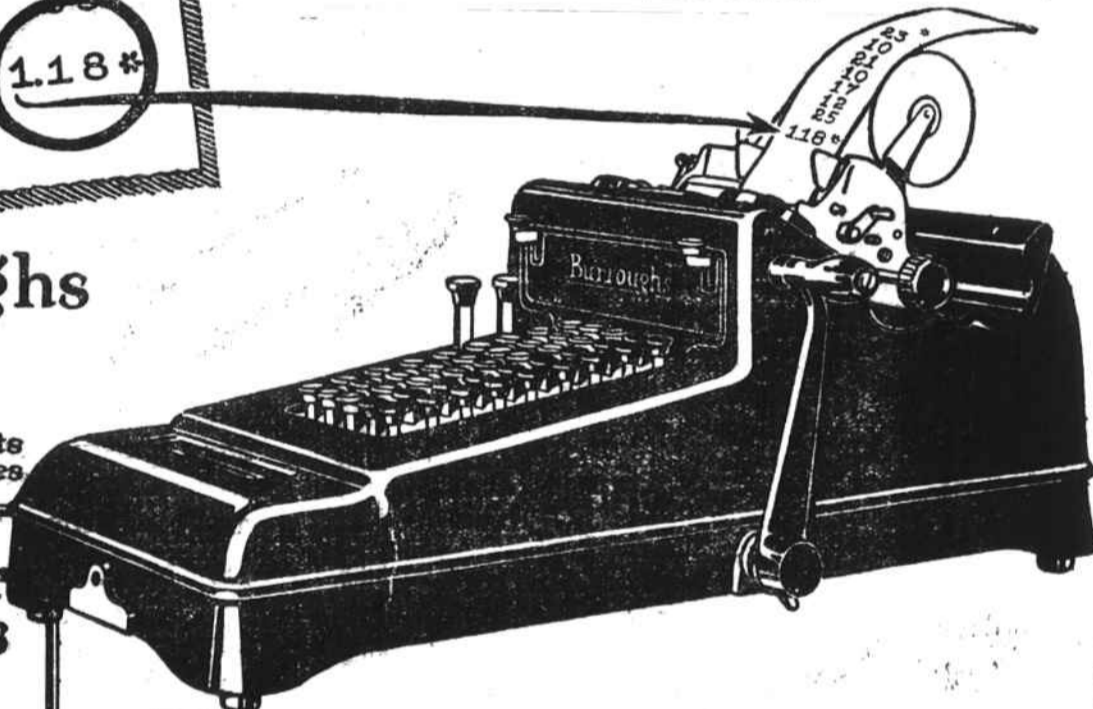

NOTICE OF SPECIAL TAX ELECTION

Upon petition signed by the required number of citizens of the Pilot School District, Franklin County, State of North Carolina, said petition having been duly approved and endorsed by the County Board of Education of Franklin County, it is ordered that an election be held in said School District in accordance with the provisions of Article 17, part 7, Chapter 1, of "An Act to Amend the Consolidated Statutes and to Codify the law relating to Public Schools," enacted by the General Assembly of North Carolina at its regular session in 1923, at which election shall be ascertained the will of the people within said School District whether or not there shall be levied a special annual tax of not more than 50 cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation of property within said District to supplement the public school fund which may be apportioned to said district by the County Board of Education and in case such special tax shall be voted then it shall operate to repeal and abolish all special school taxes heretofore voted within said school district.

The said election shall be held on Monday, the 16th day of July, 1923, the polling place shall be J. M. Stallings' Store in said district; a new registration shall be made and J. M. Stallings is hereby appointed Registrar and Preston Massey, and Clellon Pearce are hereby appointed pollholders for said election.

The boundaries of said Pilot School District, as fixed by the County Board of Education, are as follows:

Beginning at the head of Strickland Mill Pond on Moccasin Creek; thence up said Creek to Mobley Spring Branch; thence up Mobley Spring Branch to the Mobley Spring; thence in a Northeasterly direction along the old William Privett line to the head of Nannie Orchard Branch; thence in an Easterly direction to the head of

Contentnea Creek; thence in a South-easterly direction to the Spring Hope road at Burwell Baker place; thence Southeast to the Nash County line at the most Northernly point where said Nash County line touches the land of John Pace; thence in a Southerly direction along said Nash County line to the New Road from Pilot to Rocky Cross; thence in a Southwesterly direction to the Southeast corner of Lonnie Jones' land; thence along Lonnie Jones' line in a Westerly direction to the E. M. Alford land; thence in a Westerly direction along the old line for E. M. Alford and J. T. Alford to Moccasin Creek, the point of the beginning.

The Registration Books shall be open from June 16th, 1923 to July 7th, 1923 and the Registrar will have said books at said polling place on each Saturday during said period from the 16th day of June, 1923, to the 14th day of July, 1923.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE INCORPORATION OF EPSOM SCHOOL DISTRICT

Upon petition of the County Board of Education of Franklin County, said petition being in due form, it is hereby ordered that an election be held in accordance with the provisions of Section 233, Article 17, Part 7, Chapter One of "An Act to Amend the Consolidated Statutes and to Codify the Laws Relating to Public Schools" enacted by the General Assembly of North Carolina at its regular session in 1923, at which election shall be ascertained the will of the people within that portion of the Epsom School District lying and being situated in Franklin County as to whether or not it shall be incorporated with that portion of the Epsom School District lying and being situated in Vance County, so as to form an incorporated school district to be known as the Epsom School District.

The said election shall be held on the 16th day of July, 1923, the polling place to be at Dickie's Store in said District. A new registration shall be made and L. O. Frazier is hereby appointed Registrar, and G. T. Ayscue, Jr. and J. H. Goodson are hereby appointed poll holders.

The boundaries of said portion of Epsom School District situate within the County of Franklin are as follows:

Beginning at a point where Lynch's Creek crosses the line of Hayesville and Franklin Townships and thence up said Creek to the Vance and Franklin County line; thence in a Northeasterly direction along said County line to a point where Vance, Franklin and Warren Counties join; thence in an Easterly direction along the Warren and Franklin County line to the point where Hayesville and Sandy Creek Townships corner in the Warren and Franklin County line; thence in a Southerly direction along said Ingleside School District line to a point where said line crosses Toole's Creek; thence down Toole's Creek to the Franklin and Hayesville Township line; thence in a Westerly direction along said Franklin and Hayesville Township line to the point of beginning.

The said election shall be held on Monday, the 18th day of July, 1923, the polling place shall be Pine Ridge School House in said district; a new

registration shall be made and Howard W. Tant is hereby appointed Registrar and J. O. Williams and F. C. Richardson are hereby appointed poll holders for said election.

The boundaries of said Pine Ridge School District, as fixed by the County Board of Education, are as follows:

Beginning at bridge over Norris' Creek on Tarboro road; thence down Norris' Creek to Crooked Creek; thence down Crooked Creek to Tar River; thence down Tar River to Nash County line; thence along Nash County line to line of Pilot District No. 4 Dunn Township; thence along line of Pilot District to Burwell Baker's in Spring Hope road, west to head of Contentnea Creek, west to new road, Faison's corner; thence to head of Baker's pond; thence along creek to beginning.
