### NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE INCORPORATION OF EPSOM SCHOOL DISTRICT

Upon petition of the County Board of Education of Franklin County, said petition being in due form, it is hereby ordered that an election be held in accordance with the provisions of Section 233, Article 17, Part 7, Chapter One of "An Act to Amend the Consolidated Statutes and to Codify the Laws Relating to Public Schools" enacted by the General Assembly of North Carolina at its regular session in 1922, at which election shall be ascertained the will of the people within that portion of the Epsom School District lying and being situated in Franklin County as to whether or not it shall be incorporated with that portion of the Epsom School District lying and being situated in Vance County, so as to form an incorporated school district to be known as the Epsom School District.

The said election shall be held on the 16th day of July, 1923, the polling place to be at Dickie's Store in said District. A new registration shall be made and L. O. Frazier is hereby appointed Registrar, and G. T. Ayscue, Jr. and J. H. Goodson are hereby appointed poll holders.

The boundaries of said portion of Epsom School District situated within the County of Franklin are as follows:

Beginning at a point where Lynch's Creek crosses the line of Hayesville and Franklin Townships and thence up said Creek to the Vance and Franklin County line; thence in a Northerly direction along said County line to a point where Vance, Franklin and Warren Counties join; thence in an Easterly direction along the Warren and Franklin County line to the point where Hayesville and Sandy Creek Townships corner in the Warren and Franklin County line; thence in a Southerly direction along said Ingleide School District line to a point where said line crosses Toole's Creek; thence down Toole's Creek to the Franklin and Hayesville Township line; thence in a Westerly direction along said Franklin and Hayesville Township line to the point of beginning.

The Registration Books shall be open from June 16th, 1923 to July 7th, 1923 and the Registrar will have said books at said polling place on each Saturday during said period from the 16th day of June, 1923, to the 14th day of July, 1923.

Beginning at bridge over Norris' Creek on Tarboro road; thence down Norris' Creek to Crooked Creek; thence down Crooked Creek to Tar River; thence down Tar River to Nash County line; thence along Nash County line to line of Pilot District No. 4 Dunn Township; thence along line of Pilot District to Burwell Baker's in Spring Hope road, west to head of Contentnea Creek, West to new road, Faison's corner; thence to head of Baker's pond; thence along creek to beginning.

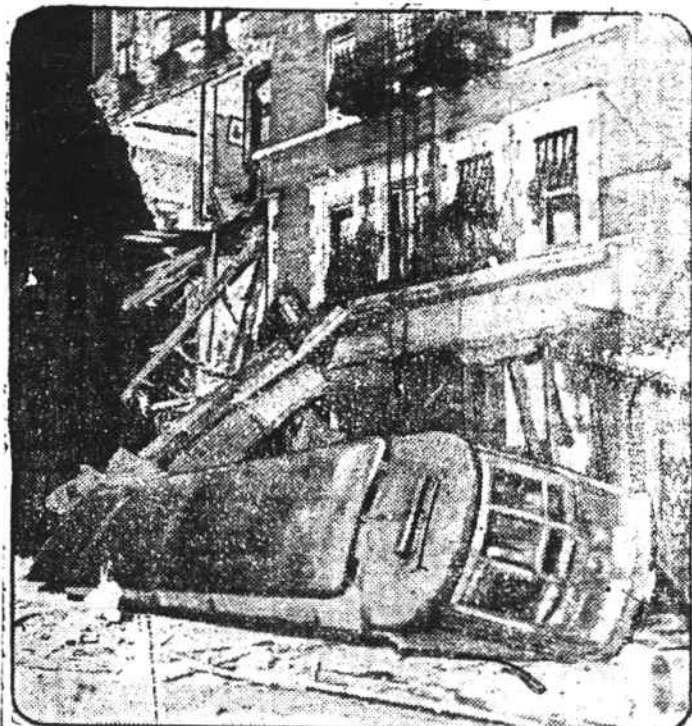

### Wreck of a Runaway Car



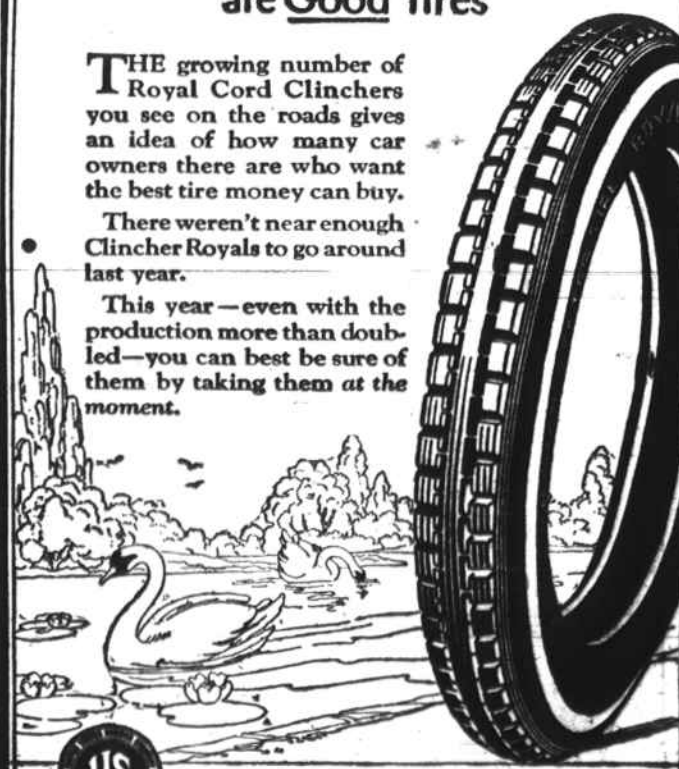
