TO AUTOMOBILISTS

This is to call the attention of all owners and drivers of automobiles in Louisville to the fact that the State Automobile laws will be strictly enforced on and after July 1st, 1923. Your attention is called to the following laws and you are urged to comply with them and save embarrassment and costs: Children under 16 years of age are prohibited from driving automobiles. Speed limited to 10 miles in the business district and 20 miles in residential district. All automobiles must be provided with mufflers and cut outs must be closed. All automobiles are required to be parked to the right at an angle of about 40 degrees, with front wheel touching curb. All cars must have two front lights and one rear light.
