N ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$50,000.00 BONDS OF THE TOWN OF LOUIS-BURG, N. C. FOR FUNDING OUT-STANDING INDEBTEDNESS.

STANDING INDEBTEDNESS.
The Board of Commissioners of the Town of Louisburg, N. C. do ordain:
Section 1. Negotiable bonds of the Town of Louisburg, N. C. shall be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Morth Carolina as re-enacted and amended by the Extra Session of the North Carolina Legislature 1921, it being Chapter 106 of the Extra Session Public Laws 1921, entitled, "An Act to Amend and Re-enact the Municipal Finance Act, being Sections 2918-2961, of a certain tracts and interest in and to the following lands: Five-elevenths of a certain tract of land containing.

Section 3. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said oonds shall be annually levied and

Section 4. A statement of the deb of the Town of Louisburg, N. C. has been filed with the Clerk of said town pursuant to the said Municipal Fi-nance Act, Chapter 106 Extra Session Public Laws 1921, and is open for public inspection.


