1923—Assailed wet forces and practically put republican party on record as opposing any attempt to nullify the 18th amendment. Urged formation of consumers' co-operative ormation of consumers co-operative or-ganizations, under government sup-ervision, to combat soaring prices. Visited western states and Alaska. Stricken ill at Seattle on return from Alaskan trip, forced to bed at San Francisco, and remainder of trip can


