GARDENING FOR MARCH
March is the month when extensive operations in the open garden are begun.

Frequent tillage keeps the soil in good condition and prevents the development of weeds.

Vegetables to plant in the open: Spinach, kale, mustard, turnips, beans, peas, parsley, Irish potatoes, beets, radish, parsnips, salsify, lettuce, carrots, onions.

Transplant to the open: Cabbage, cauliflower, lettuce. To the cold frame, tomato, pepper. Hot bed, sweet potatoes.

Our motto: "Year round garden." Let's learn to eat a new vegetable each season.

HAVE YOU HAD THESE PUBLICATIONS?

Raleigh, Feb. 26.—The agricultural publications issued by the Extension Division of the State College and Department are free to citizens of North Carolina on application. The College does not maintain a large mailing list to which are sent all publications as issued. This practice was discontinued several years ago because of the waste of printed material. However, the College will send any publication in its files, as long as the supply lasts, to any citizen making application for same. This assures that the bulletin is really wanted and will not be thrown away.

Several interesting publications have recently been issued. Among these are:

Extension Circular 139—Food Preparation and Meal Planning for Women.

Extension Circular 140—Lessons in Food Preparation for Girls.

Extension Circular 141—Fertilizers for North Carolina Soils.

Extension Circular 142—Lessons in Poultry Feeding.

Extension Circular 143—A Swine Feeder's Guide.

Extension Folder 14—Boll Weevil Program for North Carolina.

The publications on foods will be of especial value to women and girls enrolled in the club work of the home demonstration division. The young folks will want the lessons about raising and handling poultry. Those farmers feeding hogs for market will find the "Swine Feeder's Guide" a most valuable help. This is prepared in the form of a chart and may be hung in the feed house. There has already been a great demand for the little folder on the boll weevil. About six thousand copies have already been distributed and the other ten thousand are fast disappearing.

The Extension Division has also reprinted Extension Circular 101 which is a spray calendar for apples; Extension Circular 183, which is a folder on feeding hogs, and Extension Folder 11 on gardening essentials. These publications are all available on application. A card to the Agricultural Editor, Extension Division, Raleigh, N. C. will bring your copy free of charge.
