TORNADO DEATH LIST PLACED AT 111

South Carolina Hardest Hit of Seven States Visited By Tornadoes, Death Toll Being Placed at 81

RELIEF MEASURES IN STRICKEN AREAS NOW ARE WELL UNDER WAY

Estimates of Property Damage Placed At Ten Million Dollars; Scores of Villages Levelled By Devastating Storms; Many of The Injured Expected To Die; South Carolina Governor and State Red Cross Officials Form Agency For Wholesale Relief Work; Surveys of Communities Visited By Destructive Winds Under Way To Ascertain Needs of Sufferers; North Carolina Victims Increase Death Toll; Local Volunteer Workers Take Up Task of Relief.

Atlanta, Ga., May 1.—Towns and rural communities, stricken by an epidemic of tornadoes that dipped ruthlessly through seven Southern states yesterday, were recovering slowly tonight. Relief workers from organized services and volunteers, had their tasks well under way in the sorrows of villages levelled.

Reports gathered placed the total death list at 111. There still was no definite estimate of the persons injured, but belief persisted that the number would reach 500. Property damage will be much greater than at first anticipated, it was indicated today. The only estimate attempted—that of \$10,000,000—probably will be eclipsed in the final check up. South Carolina was worst stricken of the seven states visited by the tornadoes. Red Cross workers and others were at Anderson and Horrell Hill settlements. State troops were on guard. Property damage at Anderson alone was \$750,000.

List of Dead. Latest tabulations disclosed the following deaths: South Carolina, 81; Georgia, 13; Alabama, 11; North Carolina, 4; Louisiana, 1; Arkansas, 1. Two additional deaths were reported from Columbia, where two injured persons died in hospitals, and at Rober sonville, N. C., where belated reports told of a twister striking there. Thirty homes were said to have been destroyed, and an appeal for aid was sent out by Mayor G. H. Cox. One unidentified woman was killed.

START RELIEF WORK IN SOUTH CAROLINA

Columbia, S. C., May 1.—(By the Associated Press.) Organizing for relief measures following Wednesday's scourge of tornadoes, which caused the death of eighty two persons in South Carolina, a central committee to administer state-wide aid to the hundreds of injured and the thousands homeless was formed today at a conference attended by Governor Thomas G. McLeod, state officials and representatives of the American Red Cross.

Relief Measures "The central committee will assume active charge of all state-wide relief measures that have been undertaken to aid storm sufferers by local organizations," said a statement issued by the executive after the conference, which was held in his office here. Surveys instituted in the dozen wind-swept communities today were well on their way tonight to determine their needs of the destitute in the centers of distress, where estimates placed property losses at well above the million mark. Severely injured in various hospitals are expected to swell the roll of dead now set at eighty-one.

VETS HOSPITALS TO HAVE BUSINESS MANAGERS

Washington, D. C., May 5.—Following an entirely new policy, the United States Veterans' Bureau will appoint, as soon as they are available, business executives for approximately 50 veter-

ans' hospitals, it is stated in an announcement by the United States Civil Service Commission today. The Commission will receive applications for positions of business executive until May 20. The salaries range from \$3,000 to \$5,000 a year. The business executive at a hospital will serve under the general direction of the medical officer in charge, and will relieve him of all details of business management. Applicants will be rated on their training, experience and fitness, weighted at 80 per cent, and a discussion and plan of organization, weighted at 20 per cent. Full information and application blanks may be secured from the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C., or the secretary of the local board of civil service examiners at the post office or customhouse in any city.
