AGREEMENTS TO ARBITRATE
The new tendency in securing better relations between employers and employees is along the line of what might be called voluntary scientific arbitration. Initial steps to replace litigation with arbitration in settlement of business disputes are being taken by representatives of important commercial and trade organizations throughout Massachusetts, at conference under auspices of State Chamber of Commerce.

Resolutions were unanimously adopted recommending enactment of legislation patterned after New York and New Jersey statutes, whereby agreements to arbitrate, made in writing as part of business contracts, become binding and irrevocable. The award of arbitrators, if made in accordance with agreement, will be given the force of judicial decision when duly recorded in any court. Law would preserve to disputants all their essential rights.

NORTH CAROLINA WEEKLY INDUSTRIAL REVIEW

Federal Reserve Board reports Continued Increase in Production of Basic Commodities since first of present year. Wholesale and retail distribution are growing, also. Factory employment increased five per cent since January. Building trades activities increased seven per cent over same period in 1923.

Sunburst—Site selected for Susan Inman Memorial Methodist Episcopal church. Cotton acreage planted in North Carolina this year to be greatest in history of state.

Kinston—Eastern Carolina Chamber of Commerce to spend \$100,000.00 within period of five years in 46 counties covered by organization, for construction of school, roads and public buildings.

Taylorsville—Contract awarded for improvement of city streets. Sanford—Excavation under way for construction of six-story hotel.

McLeansville—Plans under way for erection of 3,000 spindle cotton mill. Kinston—Farmers & Merchants Bank lets contract for six-story building.

Raleigh—Entire holdings of Canton North Carolina Electric Company purchased by New York interests. New owners plan extensive development in western North Carolina.

Raleigh—Building operations, re-sumption of road building and general quickening of business, together with call for farm workers, are responsible for a sharp advance in demand for labor. Not in recent years has there been so widespread a demand. There is a serious shortage in farm workers generally and a heavy demand for common labor in towns and cities. Skilled labor and demand are fairly well balanced.

Beacon Mfg. Company of New Bedford, Mass., cotton blanket manufacturers, has purchased land in North Carolina to erect branch plant. Asheville—Southern Railway Company inaugurates "Tennessee-Carolina Automobile Special" between Cincinnati and Asheville, to handle growing movement of automobile and accessories.

Hendersville — \$100,000 development project announced for Indian Cave Park, including construction of 12 cottages at \$2,500 each and installation of electric light system. Roanoke Rapids—Virginia Railway & Power Company buys Roanoke Rapids Power Company's property in \$1,000,000 deal.

Charlotte—Chamber of Commerce to spend \$16,000 advertising city in national publications. Kinston—Site secured for construction of eight-story hotel. Chimney Rock—Hotel at Sugar Loaf to be enlarged and improved.

Greenville—Money appropriated for construction to Paint Rock. Wilmington—Dredging operations on new ocean bar channel at mouth of Cape Fear river to start, estimated cost \$420,000. Rockingham—Richmond county farmers produced 20,334 bales of cotton in 1923, as compared with 13,623 in 1922.

Jacksonville—Onslow county to start immediate construction of new county home, plans include three modern brick buildings. Wilson—New court house and jail to be erected at a cost of \$400,000. Williamston—Material assembled and work started on construction of power line to Everett.

Newton—School building costing \$50,000 to be erected on main highway. Charlotte—Contracts awarded for six houses at total cost of \$29,000. Wilmington—Over 5,800 cars of fertilizer shipped from district to interior points to date for present season.

Hamlet—Seaboard Air Line Railway establishes freight service to Wilmington to be maintained on schedule time. Asheville—Plans completed for construction of two additional hotels in this section. Jamestown—Plans formulating for development of Deep river through Guilford and Randolph counties to Monroencure, covering distance of 114 miles.
