Little Miss Duke, of Jackson, is spending some time with her Aunt, Mrs. John Neal.

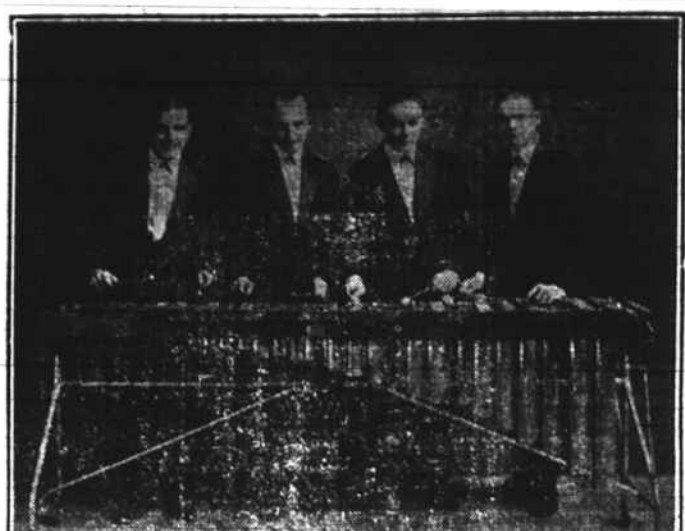
