The association which is composed of cotton manufacturers of the entire country from New England to Tayas adopted resolvents. New England to Texas adopted resolu-tions to the effect that cooperative marketing would tend to secure for both the manufacturers and the producers a fair price for cotton. The

resolutions follows:
Whereas the old method of marketing cotton has permitted an undue pressure on the market at the beginning of the season and has encouraged speculation at various stages later

in the season and,
WHEREAS such conditions tend toward violent fluctuations in prices of the staple with attendant hesitation and uncertainty in the dry good market and,
WHEREAS these evils both in the

cotton market and the cotton goods market can only be corrected by an the cotton crop.

THEREFORE be it resolved that the cooperative handling and mark-

eting of cotton by its producers can best bring about these resul's, RESOLVED further that the Ameri-

can Cotton Manufacturers Associa-tion in convention assembled this 28th day of May, 1924 endorses the coopera-tive idea of marketing as above out lined to the end that an adequate and uniform supply of cotton may be secured for the manufacturers and at as high a price for the producer as the natural and unrestricted law of supply and demand will permit."
