

certificates with the city treasurer and the issuance of a tag in evidence of such vaccination the fee to be charged for such vaccination and to regulate the killing of all dogs running at large unless wearing such tag.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Louisburg, N. C.

Section 1. The owners and keepers of all dogs either male or female in the town of Louisburg, N. C. are hereby required to have such dogs vaccinated against Rabies with Jena-Sal Canine Anti-rabies vaccine by a licensed graduate veterinarian on and by the first day of September, 1925, and each year thereafter and to procure a certificate of such vaccination on or by said date to present the same to town treasurer of said town who shall register such vaccination certificate. Said veterinarian to furnish owner of each and every dog a metal tag which shall be in force until the 30th day of August of each following year thereafter and such tag shall be securely attached to a collar and worn continuously by the dog for which it was issued, all tags to be of uniform conspicuous color easily seen and the color to be changed the following year so that the same color shall not be used for any two successive years. All puppies born or brought into said town shall be vaccinated within 90 days from date of birth and subject to the regulations herein provided for dogs.

Section 2. That every veterinarian who vaccinates any such dogs either male or female within the town of Louisburg, N. C. shall collect his fee from the owner of the dogs and shall issue a certificate of vaccination to such owner stating the owners name a brief description of the dog the date of vaccination and the fee collected by him for same, provided, however, that the fee charged by such veterinarian for such vaccination including furnishing the vaccine, metal tag and issuing the vaccination certificate, shall not extend the sum of \$2.00 per head.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any dog either male or female to run at large within the town of Louisburg, N. C. unless wearing a tag as provided in Section 1 hereof, any dog so running at large within the town of Louisburg, N. C. shall be impounded for a period of THREE days. Owner to be notified if known and upon payment of cost and complying with this ordinance owner can have same if said dog or dogs are not claimed within THREE days it shall be the duty of the chief of police or any of his officers to convey to suitable place kill and bury or burn same.

Section 4. That any dog which may follow or be led by a countryman or traveler through Louisburg, N. C. while with its owner or keeper or near the animal or animals or effects of same shall not be arrested impounded nor killed unless said dog remains in Louisburg for more than 12 successive hours, in which event same must be governed by regulations applying to resident dogs of said town.

Section 5.—It shall be unlawful for any person or persons owning or keeping any female dog to let her run at large in the town of Louisburg, N. C. while she is in heat whether she be licensed and tagged as herein required or not and any female dog found running at large in the town of Louisburg, N. C. during such period shall be impounded for a period of THREE days owner to be notified if known and upon payment of cost owner can have same if not claimed within THREE days it shall be the duty of the chief of police or any of his officers to convey said dog or dogs to a suitable place kill and bury or burn same.

Section 6. No person shall own or harbor any dog either male or female which is notoriously vicious or dangerous.

Section 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed in so far as they conflict herewith and no further.

Section 8. That any person who violates any of the sections or provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than FIVE dollars nor more than TWENTY-FIVE.

Section 9. That on account and by reason of the danger to inhabitants and persons within the Town of Louisburg, N. C. from vicious and rabid dogs an emergency exists by reason of which it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public safety that this ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication and it is ordained that same so take effect.
