invited to attend. The question of membership in the Court is to be passed upon.

It is announced by the Banking Department of the Corporation Commission that the present resources of the State banks are more than eighteen million dollars greater than they were a year ago which is taken to indicate a rapid growth of the State's financial institutions. Combined resources of State and National banks in the State at present, according to the Commission, are \$494,698,915, an increase of twenty-one million "since this time last year."

Prof. N. C. Newbold, director of the bureau of negro education of the State Department of Education, reports that Steven C. Krishnappa, of Madras, India, is here studying educational methods. Also, Archdeacon Mathers, a Church of England educator in Egenda, East Africa, has been here "taking lessons" in North Carolina's educational system. The latest foreign arrival on a similar mission is Father Harry Buck, an Anglican church educator, whose work lies in Rhodesia.

The State is suing the Massachusetts Bonding and Surety Company for \$5,000 on the bond of J. P. Morgan, local manager of the State's cotton warehouse at Benson. The amount involved is \$996.32 which the State stands to lose by the acts of Morgan in the event the bonding company cannot be held liable. The suit was brought by the office of the Attorney General and names the Corporation Commission and names State Treasurer Lacy as plaintiff.

Director I. O. Schaub, of the Agriculture Extension of State College, was elected chairman of the extension section of the American Association of Land Grant Colleges during the session of that organization held in Chicago last week. This is considered a distinct recognition of extension work in North Carolina and the associates of Director Schaub feel an especial pride in the signal honor that has come to him. He is a native of Stokes county, this state, and is one of the youngest men in point of service in the United States.

Chairman Frank Page, of the State Highway Commission, has been telling Raleigh civic clubs about some of the things he observed on his recent trip to South America as a member of the American Road Commission appointed by President Coolidge to make a study of highways in that country. He found difficulty in calling places by correct names down that way, but was greatly interested in the possibilities of road construction in the Panama territory and the immense engineering feat of the Canal itself. Mr. Page thinks the United States leads in the sale of motor vehicles in the South American countries and is likely to hold the "upper hand" for some time to come.

State College is soon to spend \$200,000 in the construction of an electrical engineering and physics building and extensions to Tompkins Hall and the textile building. The new electrical building, to be located south of Ricks Hall, will be so constructed that additional stories and a wing may be added, making it correspond to the
