NOTICE OF SPECIAL TAX ELECTION

Upon petition duly endorsed by the governing school boards of at least a majority of the school districts within the special school taxing district to be known as EPSOM SCHOOL TAXING DISTRICT, said petition having been duly approved by the County Board of Education of Franklin County, it is ordered that an election be held in accordance with the provisions of Article 18, Part 7, Chapter One of "An Act to Amend the Consolidated Statutes and to Codify the Laws Relating to Public Schools" enacted by the General Assembly of North Carolina at its regular session in 1923, at which election shall be ascertained the will of the people within said special school taxing district whether or not there shall be levied a special annual tax of not more than thirty cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of property to supplement the public school fund, which may be apportioned to the proposed special school taxing district by the County Board of Education; and in case such special tax is voted it shall operate to repeal and abolish all school taxes heretofore voted in any local tax or special charter district located within the said special school taxing district.

The said election shall be held on the 9th day of February, 1926, the polling place to be at Dickie's Store in said district. A new registration shall be made and D. T. Dickie is hereby appointed registrar, and T. H. Weldon and G. T. Aycus are hereby appointed poll holders in said election.

SPECIAL SCHOOL TAXING DISTRICT KNOWN AS EPSOM

"Beginning at a point where the Alert-Henderson Road crosses the Franklin-Warren County line, corner of Gold Sand Special Taxing District; thence in a southerly direction along said line to O. Z. NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FOR SCHOOL BONDS

Upon the petition of the County Board of Education of Franklin County for an election to be held in the Epsom School Taxing District, Hayesville Township, Franklin County, State of North Carolina, said petition being in due form, it is ordered that an election be held in said district in accordance with the provisions of Section 257, Article 22, Part VIII, Chapter 136, Public Laws of North Carolina and acts amendatory thereto, at which election shall be ascertained the will of the people within said district whether there shall be issued bonds for the sum of THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS for the purpose of acquiring, erecting, enlarging, altering and equipping school buildings and purchasing sites in said district, or for any one or more of said purposes; and for levying a sufficient tax for the payment of said bonds with principal and interest. Said bonds to bear interest at a rate not exceeding 6 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually. Said bonds shall be serial bonds maturing serially over a period of thirty years, the maximum tax rate to be levied for payment of interest and principal of said bonds shall not exceed 50c on the one hundred dollars valuation of property, real and personal.

The said election shall be held on the 9th day of February 1926. The polling place shall be at Dickie's Store in said district. A new registration shall be made and L. O. Frazier is hereby appointed registrar, and Geo. Hayes and N. H. Smith are hereby appointed poll holders for said election.

THE BOUNDARIES AS FIXED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION ARE AS FOLLOWS:

"Beginning at a point where the Alert-Henderson Road crosses the Franklin-Warren County line, corner of Gold Sand Special Taxing District; thence in a southerly direction along said line to O. Z. Edwards' mill on Devil Cradle's Creek, corner for Ingleside Special Tax District; thence up said creek to Dement's old mill at Wilson's bridge, corner for Ingleside Special Tax District; thence southeasterly along said Ingleside Special Tax District to Tool's Creek; thence down said creek to a point where said creek crosses Hayesville-Franklin Township line; thence in a westerly direction along the said line to Vance County; thence along the Franklin-Vance County line in a northerly direction to Warren County; thence along the Franklin-Warren County line to the beginning."

The ballots to be used in said election shall have written or printed thereon "For the issuance of \$30,000 school bonds and the levying of a tax for the payment thereof;" and "Against the issuance of \$30,000 school bonds and the levying of a tax for the payment thereof."
