OUR OUTSTANDING NEED AS I SEE IT

You may not agree with me in what I shall say, for as a man thinketh in his heart so he is.

We have studied for a month the church's responsibility for amusements and recreation. These are alright if properly carried on. I confess my inability to know how it should be done. We think and plan for our young people mentally and socially, this we should do but what are we doing for them spiritually? Jesus loved the great outdoors but we have not been able to find where any of His time was spent in fun and frolic. Some tell us that Jesus took a part in social activities by attending the marriage feast, etc. To my mind He had a two fold purpose in attending this feast. First to set an example that Christ should be invited to every marriage altar and consecrate and sanctify it as holy and sacred. His presence exalted the occasion. Second, He had a mission to fill a work to perform. In turning the water to wine He demonstrated the power of God invested in His son. The task of redeeming a lost world was so great that the Master spent his time in preparation and service. Prayer was not merely one of the outstanding phases of our Lord's spiritual life. It stands by itself and was the manifestation of his personal and essential relationship to God the father. During His earthly ministry He was accustomed to speak to the Father as to one of His disciples. In Luke 3:21,22 we read Jesus also having been baptized and praying, the heaven was opened and the Holy Ghost descended upon Him and a voice came from heaven saying "Thou art my beloved son, in whom I am well pleased."

Thus His earthly ministry was begun in prayer. He spent nights in prayer, long before day and at the sunset hour we find him praying in the wilderness teaching us the need of secret prayer. He prayed before eating, teaching the duty of giving thanks. He prayed on the mountain top teaching that all work designed for God's glory should begin with prayer. He took Peter, James and John upon Mount Tabor teaching the need of united prayer. He prayed all night before choosing the twelve. They fasted and prayed ten days before they were given power to help others. All the great events of his life were preceded by prayer. His disciples counted his prayer life and coming into communion with Him, by His spirit in Jesus name, brings the God created prayer and this prayer is answered. We do not read where Christ taught them how to preach or teach. He taught them to pray. Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest that He send forth laborers into his harvest. The only thing for which he asked his disciples to pray. Not a word about money or organizations, but only prayer to God, and He will send forth the laborers. This brings me to my subject, our outstanding need as a church or individuals is prayer.

We have failed to pray. The family altars have passed away. The old time prayer meetings have passed away. A testimonial service is a thing of the past. C. E. has no place for prayer, and in fact all our services need more time given to prayer. A visitor from another church was present in both services last Sunday. He afterwards asked if the Christian church believed in prayer. What an indictment to the great example Christ so faithfully gave us. We are entering upon the threshold of another revival season but will there be a revival? The preacher cannot bring a revival alone but united prayer will bring a revival if we were as interested in our church, our community and ourselves from a spiritual standpoint as we are in material and social activities, we would long ago been spending hours for a real revival. Yes the church the community and you and I need to catch a new vision of our duty. How are we measuring up to the christian standard of giving our best in soul winning? We need a great awakening. Jesus said, "and if I be lifted up I will draw all men unto me." We are failing to lift up Christ as we should for he has a magnetic power that draws on and on. If our young people could see the love and beauty of Christ exemplified in our lives they would be contented to follow Him. We need to pray as heart O God, and repew a right spirit within me. Restore unto me the power of thy salvation and uphold me with thy free spirit. Then I will teach transgressors thy ways and sinners shall be converted unto thee when the church prayed the prison chains were broken. Peter was freed and the jailer converted. When Peter lifted Christ on the day of Pentecost 3,000 souls were saved. The gospel is not intended to amuse but to compel. For it is the power of God unto salvation for all who will believe prayer is the only connection with God's great power house. May we keep that connection clear. Jesus began his ministry with prayer. His last prayer was for his murderers. He is now at the fathers right hand ever praying for you and me. O, that we might pray. Lord, forgive that we have not all with one accord continued steadfastly in prayer. This is our sinas individuals and as members of the body of Christ. Lord cleanse us, and fill us with thy spirit that we may teach others the way. If Jesus the son of God, who was without sin needed to spend so much time in prayer, how much more do we poor weak, sinful creatures need to pray. May we remember that a deep prayer life means a close walk with God and reveal one that is happy in His service.
