### SUMMER PREPARATIONS

Patterns 8070 and 8934  
The Summer months will be far happier to a little girl who has a couple of smart new dresses to wear, and both of these will be fine all summer long. 8070 is a basque style with flaring gored skirt and puff sleeves.

The jumper frock, 8934, with its round-sleeved blouse, is a classic standby for school days, just as pretty as it can be. Notice how slim and smooth it is around the waist. Make up the basque frock in plaid or checked gingham, printed percale, or pique.

Pattern 8070 is designed for sizes: 4, 6, 8, 10 and 12 years. Size 6 requires 1 3/4 yards of 35 inch material, plus 3-8 yard contrasting.

Pattern 8934 is designed for sizes: 6, 8, 10, 12 and 14 years. Size 8 requires 1 3/4 yards of 35 inch material for the Jumper; 1 3-8 yards for the blouse.

You will find this a dress to wear all through the day, and as easy as an apron to get into. The sash is in back snugs the waistline and emphasizes the feminine lines of the silhouette. Collars and cuffs in contrast add a trim tailored note. For this dress choose one of the new silk crepes or, for hot weather, use the same pattern in cotton broadcloth or percale.

Pattern 8156 is designed for sizes: 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 40 and 42. Size 14 requires 4 3-8 yards of 39 inch material with short sleeves plus 1/2 yard to contrast.
