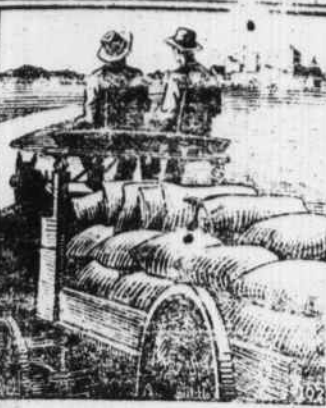


Uncle Jim Says
