**FRANKLIN COUNTY 4-H CLUB**

Thirteen 4-H Club Meetings were conducted in Franklin County during this week with one hundred and ninety-eight boys attending the meetings. More than two hundred project manuals and record books were distributed at these meetings. Health delegates from each Club were selected to represent their group at a Health Contest which was held Saturday, March 11 at the Agricultural Building, Russel Hayes, Louisburg, Rt. 3, was selected to represent Franklin County in the Health District Contest with a score of ninety-five and one-half per cent. Dr. R. F. Yarborough examined the representatives in this Contest.

L. T. Weeks, Tobacco Specialist from State College, assisted Monday, March 6 in starting four tobacco demonstrations. Two general demonstrations were started with K. S. Parrish, Louisburg, Rt. 2 and C. T. Dean, Louisburg, Rt. 4, one tobacco variety demonstration with J. W. Hudson, Youngsville, Rt. 1 and one fertilizer demonstration with J. A. Perry, Louisburg, Rt. 4 and Boswell Bowden, Mills' 4-H Club member are demonstrating tobacco plant beds sowed in rows.

Mr. J. A. Shanklin, Extension Cotton Specialist from State College, assisted in conducting a meeting to explain "One-Variety" cotton community program to the cotton ginners and cotton farmers of Franklin County. The ginners and farmers attending were much interested with the program discussed and are planning to organize their community to produce "One-Variety" cotton.
