State Director, Edgar H. Bain, announced today that each county board of commissioners will be furnished with a list of the names and addresses of all persons and firms licensed by the state to sell beer at retail in that particular county.

The committee has secured complete list of all state licensed away. retail beer dealers from the N. C. Department of Revenue, Colonel Bain said. The names will be grouped by counties, and each county will be furnished with itsown list.

According to Colonel Bain, these lists will enable the county officials to check the state list against their own lists and find out the names of any local beer outlets which have not paid their local license fees.
