A special election will be held between 6:30 A. M. and 6:30 P. M., Eastern War Time, Tuesday, September 19, 1944, at which there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the Town of Louisburg the following questions: 1. Shall an ordinance passed on the 14th day of August, 1944, authorizing not exceeding \$15,000 bonds of the Town of Louisburg for the purpose of constructing or reconstructing the surface of streets in said Town, and tax for said bonds, be approved? 2. Shall an ordinance passed on the 14th day of August, 1944, authorizing not exceeding \$5,000 bonds of the Town of Louisburg for the purpose of extending the existing water works system of said Town, including the erection and installation of additional water purification facilities, and a tax for said bonds, be approved? The questions hereinabove set forth contain a statement of the purpose for which the bonds are authorized by the ordinance referred to in each such question respectively. If the bonds are issued, a tax will be levied for the payment of the principal and interest thereof on all taxable property in the Town of Louisburg. For said election the regular registration books for elections in said Town shall be used and such books shall be open for the registration of voters, not theretofore registered, from 9:00 A.
