STATE COLLEGE ANSWERS TIMELY FARM QUESTIONS

QUESTION: What are the latest fertilizer recommendations for corn?

ANSWER: Use 300 pounds of fertilizer per acre for all sections of North Carolina. Topdress with 125 to 500 pounds of nitrate of soda; or 100 to 400 pounds of sulphate of ammonia. Calnitro, or ANL; or 60 to 250 pounds of ammonium nitrate per acre. The higher rates of topdressing are more efficient with about 8,500 plants per acre and also where nitrogen is a limiting factor. Mix 50 to 75 pounds of muriate of potash per acre with the nitrogen topdresser on potash deficient soils.

QUESTION: What questions on peanuts will the Census representative ask in January, when he visits me.

ANSWER: He will ask for the acreage of peanuts grown alone and also for the acreage grown with other crops. Then he will ask for the acres and pounds of "peanuts picked or threshed." The last question is the number of tons of peanut hay saved. The first two questions will include "total acres picked or threshed, used for hay, hogged off or grazed." Make the information you give the Census man or woman just as accurate as possible. This information is confidential.

QUESTION: Under what condition can a farmer sell meat?

ANSWER: The Extension Service is advised that farmers may sell their own meat providing they (1) collect ration stamps as required by the OPA; (2) observe OPA ceiling prices; and (3) mark the appropriate grade on the beef, veal, lamb, or mutton they offer for sale. A farmer is defined as "any person chiefly engaged in producing agricultural products as the resident operator of a farm," permitted livestock for meat sales is that grown or fed for 60 days or more by the farmer.

FRANKLIN COUNTY FARM AGENT DEPT.

I was able to secure for Franklin County farmers last week ten bushels of locally produced N.C. T-1 Hybrid seed corn. This variety of Hybrid corn was used in several of the contest plots this year, including the plots winning first, second and fourth places in the County Contest and plots winning first, second and fourth places in the Epsom Contest. Farmers visiting and studying the contest plots were unanimous in their approval of Hybrid corn for higher yields, particularly on fields where it was well manured and fertilized. These seed were reserved before entering the channels of trade and will be made available to the first farmers making reservations.

A small quantity of Variety 402 tobacco seed from Oxford Tobacco Station has been obtained for the purpose of introducing the variety to Franklin County farmers.

Variety 402 is believed to be an improvement over 401 that has been widely praised by farmers using this variety. These seed will be made available in small quantities to farmers desiring to compare this variety with their local variety. Seed will be made available to the first farmers making application. Variety 402 was selected by Franklin county farmers on their visit last summer to the Oxford Station as the variety most likely to meet unanimous approval under Franklin county conditions.

Tobacco seed cleaner operated by Franklin County Extension Service has been completely overhauled and will be available for cleaning seed, starting January 5. We do not have sufficient personnel to assure cleaning at the exact time seed are brought in by farmer, therefore we are requesting that all containers be labeled so they can be identified when called for. This service is offered without charge to the farmers for the purpose of assisting them in

establishing a better and more uniform stand of plants.

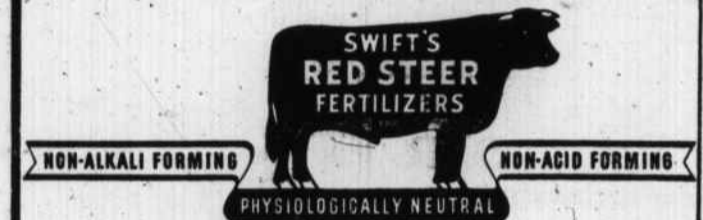
