THE PRIZE

This is a fictitious take-off on the prestige of the Nobel prize awards. Much liberty is taken and the characters selected to receive this award, in the various arts, are a group unlikely to receive any kind of honorable or coveted award. Selections for the awards are --Edward G. Robinson, a bewhiskered German-American physicist; Gerard Oury, a French biochemist and Michelle Presle, his wife. There are several doctors and surgeons nominated for awards and Paul Newman, a drunken American novelist, completes the main list.

Several incidents arise that make this a fast moving film. Communist agents kidnap Robinson and plant an impostor in his place (Robinson plays the dual role). And who do you think solves the kidnapping mystery? None other than Newman, the drunken American playwright. Screenplay writer, Ernest Lehman, provides light, amusing dialogue. And, Mr. Newman, in his less sober moments handles the dialogue quite well.

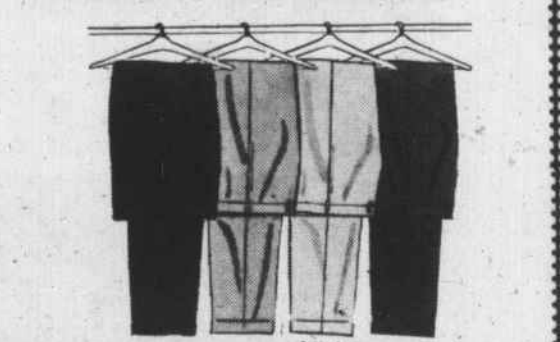

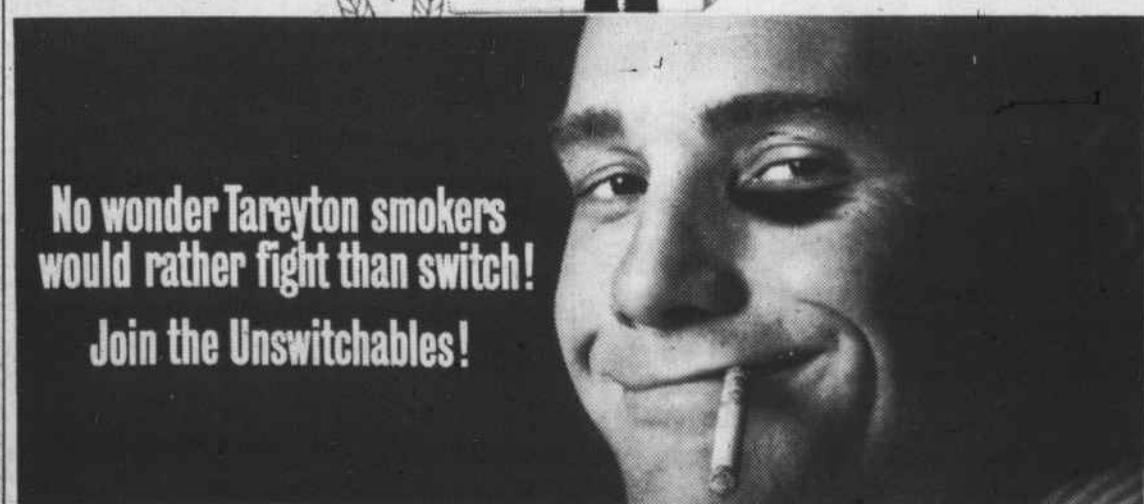
