

Burlington In First-place Tie With Teens

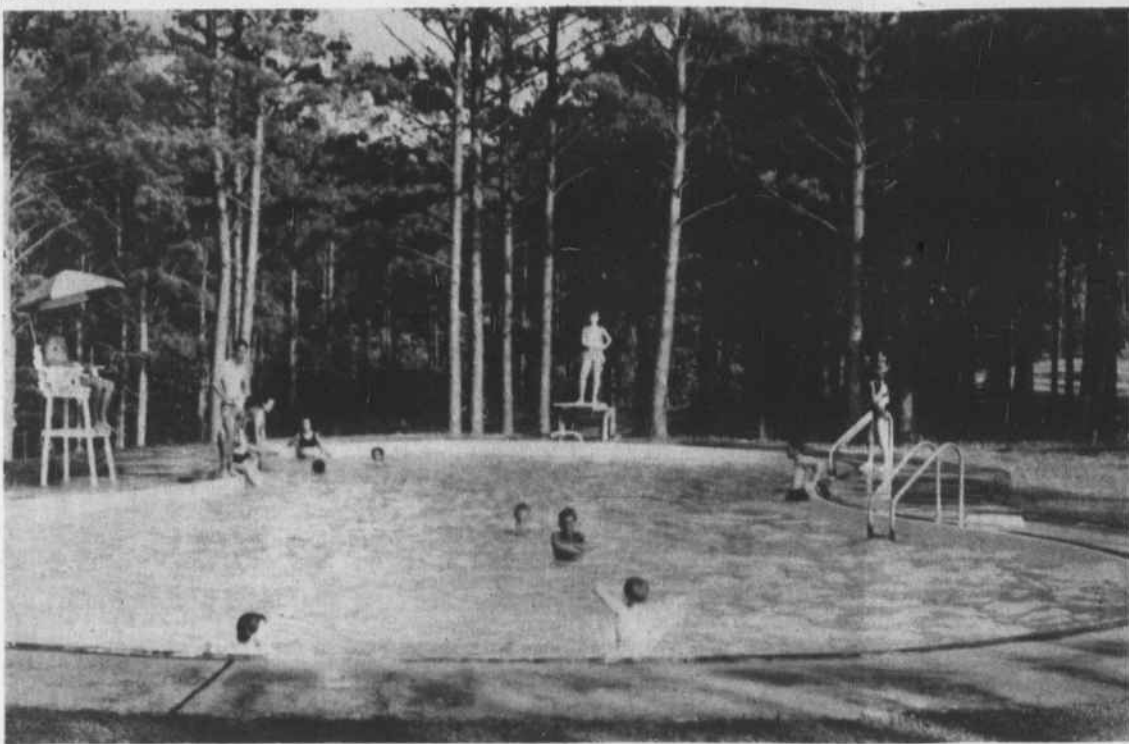
