1 teaspoon grated lemon rind 1/4 cup butter or margarine

1 teaspoon grated orange rind Combine all ingredients in small saucepan and heat until butter

or margarine is melted. Simmer about 3 minutes. Remove from heat.

Biscuit Bubbles

2 cups sifted enriched selfrising flour*

1/4 cup shortening 2/3 to 3/4 cup milk

2 teaspoons grated orange rind

Sift flour into bowl, Stir in orange rind. Cut or rub in shortening until mixture is crumbly. Add milk to make a soft dough. Turn out on lightly floured board or pastry cloth and knead gently 30 seconds. Divide dough into pieces about size of walnuts. Shape into balls. Place balls in layers in ungreased

loaf pan, 4 $1/2 \times 8 \ 1/2$ inches. Pour Orange-Honey Glaze over all. Bake in moderately hot oven (400 degrees F.) 30 to 35 minutes. Let bubble loaf cool 10 minutes in pan before serving. Remove from pan and serve hot. Makes 1 bubble loaf.

*If you don't sift or in the absence of other directions, spoon flour directly from container into a 1 cup dry measure, level off, then remove two level tablespoonfuls, according to USDA reco


