

If you are an amateur foreaster, these barometer and wind direction readings will allow you to predict good weath-

With a barometer high and rising or high and steady, or very high and falling only slowly, and wind from the southwest changing to northwest, fair weather (probably for two days) can be forecast.

If the barometer is high and rising rapidly, the fair weath er may last only a day and rain may follow.
