

# Epsom Wins Two From Louisburg

All five starting performers reached double-scoring figures for the Epsom High Tigers as Coach William Matthews' lads licked Louisburg boys, 74-60, in a Franklin County Conference cage battle on Epsom's home floor Tuesday night.

The Tiger girls made it a perfect evening for Epsom in league play as they handed the visitors a 50-34 setback in the evening's opener.

Mike Smith tapped in 18 points and Linwood Patterson got 17 to pace the winning attack. Jerry Patterson followed with eleven points and Neison Hedgepeth and Danny Rowland accounted for ten each.

The offensive battle saw Louisburg boys place four men in the double figure bracket, Bill Williamson leading with 17 points. Glenn Woodlief notched 14, Moore eleven and Howard Stallings 13.

Epsom boys now are 13-3 overall for the year and the lassies are 12-4 on the season. In conference play, the Tigers have won five of six games in both the girls' and boys' divisions.

Sandra Ayscove accounted for 14 points, Patsy Lassiter 12 and Carolyn Stainback 10 in Tuesday night's triumph for the Tigers. Best for Louisburg was Bartholomew 12, with twelve.

A major test for Epsom is on tap Friday night when the Tig-

gers play host to Bunn. Both the boys and girls at Bunn hold first place in their respective divisions, while Epsom is second in both divisions.

(2) Not counting the purchase price of the car, what does it cost to set up a late model stock car so it will be competitive on the major speedways? \$1,000? \$2,500? \$3,000? \$8,000? \$10,000?
