"Direct" Seeding of Tomatoes



Fireball, an extra-early tomato variety, is better directly in the soil where plants are to grow. Other tomato varieties also may be "direct-seeded." For names, see

While the seeds of most tomato varieties must be started indoors weeks ahead of frost-free date in the garden, there are some varieties that can be planted right out in the garden and still will produce bountiful crops within your growing season. Time to plant is after May 10 in the north, after March 20 in the south, and after April 15 in the

"middle" states. All of these varieties are "early" tomatoes-that require a shorter time to mature fruit than most kinds. Among them are the older Earlianna and Valiant, the newer tomatoes Gardener and Fireball.


