SKILLET COOKERY FOR LENTEN LUNCHES

G.S. Council Operates Two Campsites

Beginning April 15, Girl Scouts of the Pines of Carolina Girl Scout Council may register for 1966 established camp sessions at Camp Graham, near Henderson, North Carolina; and Camp Mary Atkinson, near Selma, North Carolina.

Camp Mary Atkinson will operate three sessions and Camp Graham, four sessions, as follows: June 19-July 1, July 3-July 15, July 17-July 29, and July 31-August 12 (Graham only). All sessions are open to all Junior, Cadette, and Senior Girl Scouts in the 19th county

jurisdiction. Brownie Fly-Ups who are going into the fourth grade may also register for any session.

Camp folders including registration forms will be distributed at troop meetings sometime in March. Non-Scouts and Out-of-Council Scouts may register after May 15, and should inquire through the council office, 745 Hillsboro Street, Raleigh, North Carolina, about details.

Several special units for older Cadette and Senior Scouts will be featured this year: a Vagabond trip unit and a Second-Year Counselor-in-Training course at Camp Mary Atkinson, and a Waterfront Unit, a Primitive Camping Unit, and a One-Year Counselor-in-Training course at Camp Graham. Seniors must apply for the Counselor-in-Training courses by April 1.
