# Spiritual Dev. Emphasis Set At Trinity Church

For several months the congregations of three rural churches near Louisburg, have been searching through prayer and study to come to a better understanding of the meaning of the church in a contemporary, rural setting.

Eight weeks of study in the Epistle to the Ephesians helped to produce and awareness of the Christian layman's responsibility for the quality of life in his community. It was felt that a need existed for making the Christian message known and applied to all areas of life. In recent days the lady of the three churches have made visits in the homes making
