2 slices bacon
1/4 cup sliced onion
1 can (1 pound) beans & franks in tomato sauce
1 cup cooked cut green beans
1/2 teaspoon prepared horseradish

In saucepan, cook bacon; remove and crumble. Pour off all but 1 tablespoon drippings. Cook onion until tender. Add beans and horseradish. Heat; stir now and then. Garnish with bacon. Makes 2 to 3 servings.
