Boles began putting the squad through its paces on August 15 and has made a number of changes in positions. New members have been added to the team and several eligible to return have not reported. The Rams lost eight members to graduation last year and ten boys who were members of the squad last season

are not out for football this year. Some have dropped out of school, according to reports and some others have injuries. Returning from the 1965 Ram team are: Dennis Carter, sophomore moving from fullback to a halfback post; David Secor, co-captain moved to the quarterback slot from a

Davis, the track's winningest driver, was involved in a four car pileup at the start of the fifth lap in the feature event and damage to his car put him out of the running.
