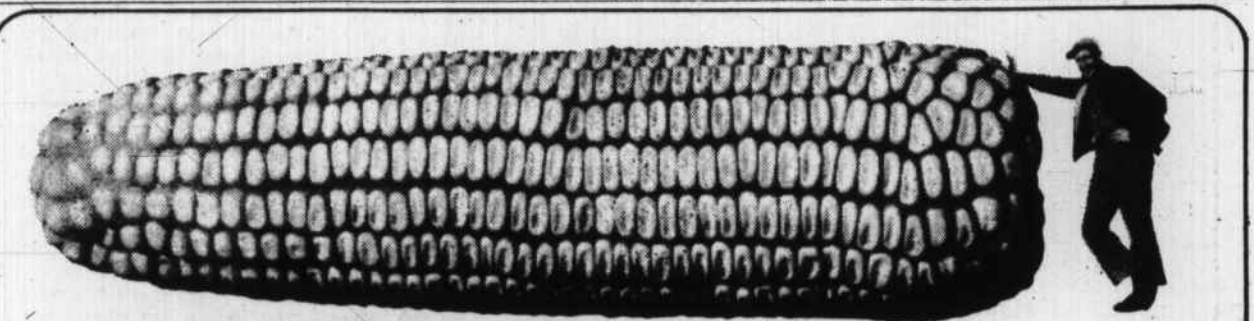
Rowe Gives Rescue Wagon
