

Bright Belt Program Announced

Many leaders in various phases of the tobacco industry will appear on the program for the 23rd annual convention of the Bright Belt Warehouse Association next month. The full convention agenda was announced today by Fred S. Royster, managing director of the association. The convention will be held at the Blockage Runner hotel at Wrightsville Beach, N. C., June 19-22.

Monday will be devoted to registration, with a cocktail hour in the evening.

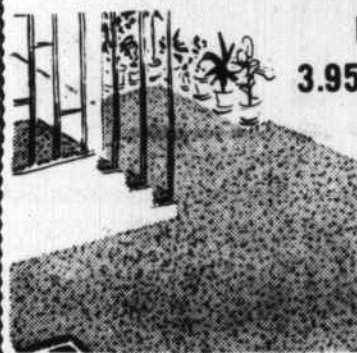
Warehousemen from the flue-cured producing States of the Southeast will attend the meeting.

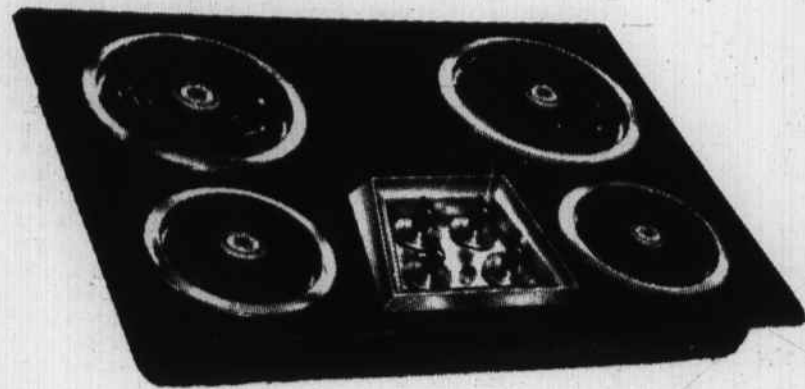

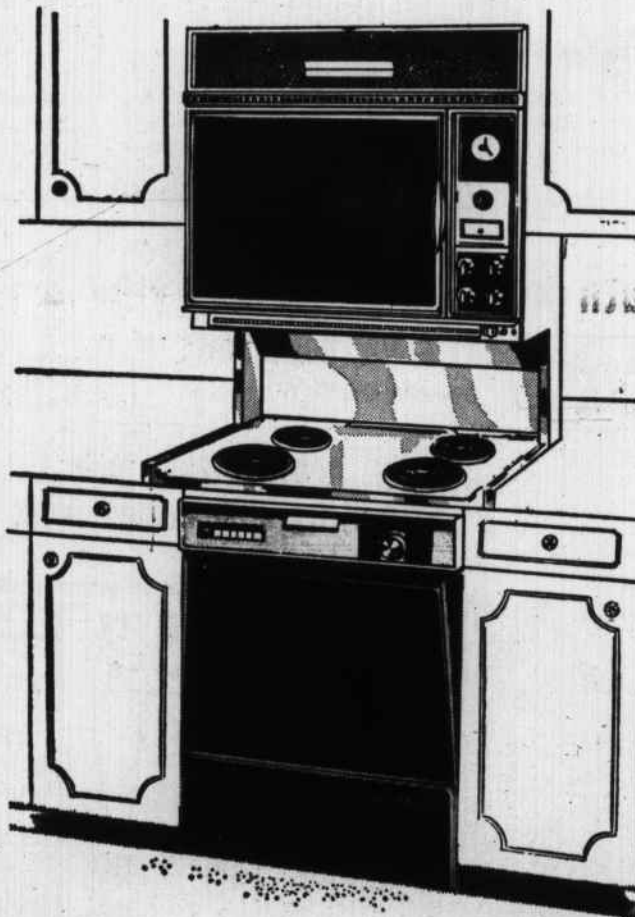
