The Louisburg Lions staged their first annual horse show here Saturday afternoon and night, with what was described as very successful results. Large crowds gathered at the county fairgrounds for both sessions.

Leading the list of top place winners was Number 14, "Whimpy," owned and ridden by Ralph Coley, Rt. 3 Henderson. Coley carried off four top awards. Following close behind with three first place finishes was Number 38, "Cracker Jack," ridden by D.N. Tucker and owned by Paul Ladd of Durham. Four horses won two first place awards. These included, Number 16, "Baskum Barney," owned by W.J. Wilson of Warrenton; Number 3, "Magohony contract," ridden by Nell Lee of Louisburg and owned by Meredith College; Number 31, "Knagros Kurky," owned and ridden by Jean Evans of Franklinton; Number 45, "Gambler's Go Bay", ridden by Floyd Farrington and owned by Mrs. Marie Edins of Zebulon.

Lynn Patterson of Louisburg won first place riding Number 13, "Cookie" in the Local

Pleasure Class.

There were 34 listed classes most with several entries. The show drew horse enthusiasts from a number of communities throughout this part of the state. Some members of the local Lions Club indicated that the project might become an annual event.

Proceeds of the gate and entries and concessions, after expenses will go to aid the Lions Club in its work in helping the blind.

M.G. (Monk) Wilder was General Chairman of the project for the local club and G.M. (Buddy) Beam is club president. C.T. Dean was ringmaster for the event and Ernest Bowers of Norwood, N.C. was Judge.
