### Youngsville Board Meets

Youngsville - The Youngsville Town Board of Commissioners met at the Town Hall Monday night, January sixth, with Mayor W. M. Roberts presiding at the regular monthly meeting.

Approval of building plans was given by commissioners to the Kaiser Agricultural Chemicals Corporation for the erection of a storage building and office which the company proposes to put on the former John Mitchell property on West Main Street. Explanations of proposed building were made by Commissioners D. H. Cyrus, Sr., with discussions led by Commissioners M. D. Hoyle and W. T. Moss. Plans call for the John Mitchell store building, which has not been occupied in recent years, to be taken over to make way for the new buildings.

Mr. J. A. Green was re-appointed to serve as Town Tax Collector for the coming year.

Report was made on the annual audit of Town Books as recently completed by Mr. Lonnie R. Shuping, CPA, of Louisburg. Copies of the written report of audit were submitted to the Governing Body.

Discussion was held in regard to necessary work done recently on one of the town pumps.

### ECU Drop Hurricanes

East Carolina Freshmen handed Louisburg its second loss of the season last night in a game in Minges Coliseum on the Greenville campus. The score was 84-71 in a game that was close most of the way.

The 'Canes were down two, 32-34, at halftime. East Carolina scored the first six points of the second half to lead 40-32. The lead mounted to 11, 39-50, with 15:00 minutes remaining, but the 'Canes cut it to 5 on three straight baskets; 2 by Dick Driver and one by Terry Davis. The score stood at 45-50 with 13:00 showing on the clock. With 9:35 remaining the score was 53-59 when the Baby Bucs scored five straight points to move out front by 53-64 and the 'Canes could go no closer than 10 the rest of the way.

The Baby Bucs controlled the boards in the second half and their second-shot attempts that dropped proved the undoing of the Hurricanes. Rebounding for the game was 48-61 in favor of the Bucs but in the second half it was 17-34. East Caro-

lina shot 46% from the floor while the 'Canes hit for 39%.

Ronnie LePors led East Carolina with 21 points and 18 rebounds. Julius Prince had 16 points and eleven assists while Arnie Ruegg and Grey Crouse had 15 and 14 respectively.

Bob Walker led the 'Canes scoring with 16 points followed by Larry Paschall with 15, Davis and Driver 12 each. The rebounding was led by Davis and Driver with 13 each.

The 'Canes travel to Brevard for Friday and Saturday night doubleheaders. On Friday they play Wingate in the opening game at 7:00 o'clock. Saturday they play Brevard in the 9:00 o'clock game. Mt. Olive is the other team participating in the doubleheaders.
